A MESSAGE TO THE CLASS OF 2020 FROM THE PRESIDENT

Katie Krummeck '03

Katie Krummeck '03 is an educational designer and an international thought-leader in leveraging the power of design to drive change in the K-12 system. She is also an expert in using the design process and maker-based instruction to create student-centered learning experiences that develop students' creative confidence, optimism and problem-solving skills. Krummeck has coached school leaders, educators, nonprofit leaders and corporate executives to develop their design mindsets and the capacity to leverage design to drive innovation.

Krummeck began her career as a secondary teacher and co-founder of an independent school where students collaborated across age groups to engage in project-based, interdisciplinary learning. She has since worked on the national team of an education nonprofit startup, helped develop the K12 Lab at the Hasso Plattner Institute for Design at Stanford University, and directed a collegiate makerspace. Krummeck also founded the Maker Education Project at Southern Methodist University, an initiative dedicated to catalyzing transformational maker-based learning experiences for students in K-12 schools.

Krummeck is an independent consultant based in Portland, Oregon. She also is working as a global design advisor for the Aga Kahn Foundation, an international organization that brings together human, financial and technical resources to address challenges faced by marginalized communities around the world.

Krummeck graduated from Whitman in 2003. At Whitman, she was an editor on the student newspaper, played flag football and served as a student academic advisor and resident assistant. She designed her own major in American Studies and was a founding member of the First-Generation/Working-Class student group.

DISTINGUISHED FACULTY AWARDS

Distinguished Faculty Awards honor excellence in teaching, scholarship, mentoring and advising. These awards reflect the highest recognition of Whitman College faculty excellence. All members of the campus community are invited to nominate faculty. The Alumni Association Faculty Award for Service is given yearly to a faculty member who has distinguished themselves in service to the Alumni Association.



Andrea Dobson '82

George Ball Award for Excellence in Advising

Associate Professor of Astronomy and General Studies Andrea Dobson joined the Whitman faculty in 1989. She earned a bachelor's from Whitman in 1982, and a master's and doctorate from New Mexico State University. Dobson is a committed, caring and conscientious advisor. She goes above and beyond the typical academic advising. One student wrote: "She has aided me in advising on study abroad options, summer internships, attending professional conferences, job applications, resumes and post-college paths." Besides her teaching and advising duties, Dobson also hosts over 1,500 people in the planetarium each year. She has not only had lasting impact on the students at Whitman, but also has shared her great passion and knowledge of astronomy with the community.



Thomas Armstrong

Robert Y. Fluno Award for Distinguished Teaching in Social Sciences

Thomas Armstrong came to Whitman in 2014. He has a bachelor's from Lewis and Clark College, and his master's and doctorate from Vanderbilt University. His excellent teaching, advising and engagement with students have earned praises. Many of them commented that because of their experiences inside and out of his classroom and lab, they decided to continue to study psychology or related fields. One student wrote: "Tom's Abnormal Psychology class is where my career path really clicked for me. ... It was a foundational time in my life, opening my eyes up to how I could create meaning and impact in my career."



Britney Moss

A.E. Lange Award for Distinguished Science Teaching

Britney Moss came to Whitman in 2015. She has a bachelor's from Montana State University and doctorate from Washington University in St. Louis. Moss provides a constructive, creative and supportive learning environment for students. She knows "how to teach science in a way that actively encourages participation from every member of the class without making it feel like a nerve-wracking test of knowledge in front of your peers," a student wrote. Students praise her ability to break down complex concepts into understandable ideas, as well as her willingness to devote much of her time to help students, even extending her lab time and office hours.



Alissa Corder

G. Thomas Edwards Award for Excellence in the Integration of Teaching and Scholarship

Alissa Corder came to Whitman in 2013. She has a bachelor’s degree from Bowdoin College and a master’s and doctorate from Brown University. She was nominated for the Edwards Award by her colleagues and students in recognition of the way Corder integrates research with student learning. Her accomplishments include two books, 14 peer-reviewed articles, four book chapters, a co-authored book and numerous other publications. Corder integrates her research with student learning by bringing her students in as co-researchers, and she has received numerous Louis B. Perry Research and Abshire Research grants so that students could learn and grow beyond the typical classroom setting.



Lauren Osborne

Thomas D. Howells Award for Distinguished Teaching in Humanities and Arts

Lauren Osborne came to Whitman in 2014. She has a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Music from Lawrence University and her master’s and doctorate from University of Chicago. As one her colleagues summarized, Osborne shines in the classroom, conveying the erudition that is apparent in her numerous scholarly accomplishments with the cultivated efficiency that is apparent in her willing service to the religion department, the South Asian and Middle Eastern track in the Asian and Middle Eastern Studies program, and the wider faculty. She engages her students’ senses along with their minds, producing multi-sensorial ways of knowing through parallel ways of teaching.



Daniel Schindler

Suzanne L. Martin Award for Excellence in Mentoring

Daniel Schindler is the director of theater and an associate professor of theater. He joined Whitman College in 2015. He is a member of United Scenic Artists Local # 829 (Scenic Design). He also is vice chair of Design, Technology and Management for the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival (Region 7). This year, Schindler received the Gold Medallion from that organization, recognizing his contributions to the teaching and producing of theater. “As a professor he has always made it a priority to be available for students whenever help is needed and questions need to be answered,” wrote one of his student nominators.



Michelle Janning

Alumni Association Faculty Award for Service

The 2020 Whitman College Alumni Association Faculty Award for Service is presented to Professor Michelle Janning, chair of sociology and The Raymond and Elsie Gipson DeBurgh Chair of Social Science. The Alumni Association recognizes Janning for strengthening and maintaining ties between the college and its alumni. Janning fosters connections between her students and alumni, extends her hospitality toward sociology alumni during Reunion Weekend and meets with alumni around the country to share research as well as campus news. Her service on the renovation committee for Baker Center was instrumental in keeping the design elements true to the era of the house, creating a welcoming environment for alumni returning to campus.

Randall James

North Central High School, Spokane, Washington

Randall James, a lifelong resident of Spokane, is the founder and former director of the Institute of Science and Technology at North Central High School in Spokane, Washington. He retired in June 2017. James was nominated by Kristen Wanke '20 of Spokane, a biochemistry, biophysics and molecular biology major. "Mr. James not only gave me exposure to and experience with science that was equivalent to many undergraduate college laboratories ... he also taught me how to dream big and aspire to reach my goals, something that has helped me excel in college," Wanke wrote.

James earned his Bachelor of Science in biology from the University of Oregon and his master's in biology from Eastern Washington University. He was a public high school science teacher for 39 years and won numerous national, regional and state awards. For the past 20 years, his focus has been on immersing students in authentic, novel research opportunities. His primary research focus was conservation genetics and molecular ecology. He absolutely loves teaching and his students, and believes he had the best job in the world. James firmly believes his students will solve the world's greatest challenges.
