Responsibilities for Milestone Reunion Committee Members

- Commit to attending your reunion
- Select 15-50 classmates to network with throughout the year, encouraging them to attend Reunion Weekend and participate in the class gift.
- Agree to have your name listed on letters, website and social media pages regarding reunion communications
- Take the lead make your own gift by December 31
- Complete personal notes on reunion letters or follow-up with your assigned classmates with a card or email.
- Ask classmates to attend reunion and participate in the gift via email, phone calls, and/or personal notes
- Document communications and progress in *givecampus.come/vms/whitmancollege*
- Thank donors via card, email or phone call when you receive a notification from GC VMS that a gift has been made
- Help promote annual online campaigns, such as All in for Whitman
- Post, like, and share about Whitman and Reunion Weekend on social media
- Participate in periodic conference calls with the committee and staff
- Support fellow committee members in their social and philanthropic outreach to their classmates
- Attend Convocation during Reunion Weekend to present your class gift to the President.
