Important Steps After Experiencing Sexual Assault

If you have just experienced sexual assault:

1. Get to a Safe Place

Call **509-529-9922** to reach a victim advocate who can offer confidential support. The advocate can provide medical, legal and court advocacy.

2. Preserve Evidence

If possible, avoid showering, changing clothes or eating before seeking medical care. These steps can help preserve evidence.

3. Seek Medical Attention

Even if you're unsure about reporting the assault, it's important to get medical care within three days to collect evidence and treat potential injuries or STIs. A medical practitioner can treat injuries, provide emergency contraception and offer medication to prevent sexually transmitted infections. The victim advocate can walk you through this process.

4. File a Report When Ready

You can report the incident to Whitman College via whitman.edu/assist or the Walla Walla Police Department (WWPD) at 509-527-1960. Please note that reporting an incident to the police and preserving evidence doesn't require filing a criminal complaint but keeps the option open to do so later. The WWPD Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Services Coordinator is available to help you understand your legal options. You can contact them at 509-524-4400.

5. Seek Supportive Measures

Regardless of whether you file a formal complaint, Whitman College can provide no-contact orders, academic accommodations and other supportive measures through the Title IX Office. The Title IX Coordinator (titleix@whitman.edu) will assist you in coordinating this support.

Understanding Sexual Misconduct and Your Rights

What Is Sexual Misconduct?

Sexual misconduct, including sexual harassment, sexual violence, sexual exploitation, intimate partner violence and stalking, violates Whitman College's Title IX Sexual Harassment and Sex Discrimination Policy and federal laws like the Clery Act and the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA).

Forms of Sex Discrimination Include:

- Sexual Harassment: Unwelcome conduct of a sexual nature that creates a hostile environment.
- Sexual Assault: Any nonconsensual sexual contact.
- Dating Violence: Abuse in a romantic relationship to control a partner.
- Domestic Violence: Violence by a current or former spouse or intimate partner.
- Stalking: Repeated, unwanted attention that causes fear for personal safety.

What Are My Rights?

If you are a victim of sexual misconduct, you have the right to:

- Report the offense to campus authorities or law enforcement.
- Request supportive measures like class schedule adjustments, housing changes and no-contact orders.
- Seek medical, emotional and legal assistance.
- Receive a written explanation of your rights and options.

Reporting Options

You can report sexual misconduct in the following ways:

Title IX Office: Receive guidance, supportive measures and assistance in navigating the college's complaint process.

Involvement of Law Enforcement. You have the option to:

- Be assisted by campus authorities in reporting to law enforcement if you choose.
