
## Whitman Alumni Survey: 2020, 2022, 2023 Combined Report of One, Five, and Ten Years-Out Graduates

### Current Primary Activity

## The "Gallup Big 6"

#### Highest Degree Earned

Nearly all respondents are either employed or in graduate school.



The Gallup-Purdue Index, through a study of 30,000 college graduates, identified six key elements of an undergraduate education that lead to graduates having a higher well-being and feeling more engaged in their work. Three of these relate to being supported at the institution (support statements) and the other three are about being active in campus experiences (experiential statements).


