Since this *NE example has a credit value listed, it's either AP or IB credit. Usually, AP appears with the term date of 06/30, whereas IB has a date of 07/01.

*TE indicates transfer coursework (see key at bottom).

This area gives a **key for symbols** that may appear next to courses—other common notations include :

- *RP for a course being repeated
- *RA for a replacement attempt (repeating a course with a previous grade of F)
- *F for "forced"—the course was manually inserted into a requirement by a staff member in the Registrar's Office
