Coronavirus News

Walla Walla County had two new confirmed coronavirus cases in the past 24 hours. That brings the number of confirmed cases in the county to 18.

Dr. Anthony Fauci, director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, said officials are seeing "some favorable signs" that coronavirus curve may be flattening in the United States.

Fauci says antibody tests, which show who has already been infected with the coronavirus, will be available in about a week. He said testing of people who currently have the coronavirus and antibody tests will be done in parallel.
