#### Coronavirus News

In the past 24 hours, Walla Walla County had two new reported coronavirus cases, bringing the total to 37 confirmed cases. Fifteen local residents have recovered from the virus.

At a press conference Monday evening, Washington Gov. Jay Inslee talked about a plan for reopening the state's economy that could soon allow the return of some elective surgeries, outdoor recreation and construction projects. Washington's stay-at-home order is scheduled to lift on May 4, and Inslee didn't give any specifics as to when that order may be lifted. He said his plan would only move forward once coronavirus cases have decreased enough that the state is able to manage future outbreaks.
