Coronavirus News


In the past 24 hours, seven more people in Walla Walla County tested positive for coronavirus, for a total of 51 confirmed cases in the county. Fifteen local residents have recovered from the virus.

County health officials say Walla Walla is now considered a coronavirus "hot spot" and it's more important than ever that residents stay home during the next few weeks.

Meanwhile, despite a barrage of criticism, Georgia state officials are moving ahead today with plans to allow some nonessential businesses to reopen, even as coronavirus deaths increase statewide. Georgia's governor is the first in the nation to ease stayat-home orders put in place in response to the virus.
