Coronavirus News

In the past 24 hours, there were six new positive coronavirus tests in Walla Walla County for a total of 68 confirmed cases.

Washington Gov. Jay Inslee says he'll extend the stay-at-home order for the state, and will outline what reopening the state's economy will look like on Friday. That reopening would happen when he and state officials feel the threat from the new coronavirus has receded.

The governor said in a press conference on Wednesday that public health data is leading him to extend the stay-at-home order, which has closed thousands of businesses and limited large gatherings for more than a month. That order was scheduled to lift at the end of the day on May 4. Inslee also announced on Wednesday that some elective procedures could resume at hospitals.
