Coronavirus News

In the past 24 hours Walla Walla County had three new confirmed coronavirus cases. That brings the total to 16 cases in the county.

Despite rising death tolls nationally, there are encouraging signs that parts of the U.S. may be flattening their curves, for example in Washington and California. However, officials are warning that residents have to remain vigilant to prevent a second wave of the virus.

The Chinese city of Wuhan, the original epicenter of the outbreak, has ended its 11-week lockdown. Residents will be tracked by smartphone apps to prove they are healthy and haven't interacted with anyone infected with coronavirus.

Improve Your Virtual Meeting Security

Recent news media reports relating to video conference management and security may have caught your attention. WCTS wants you to know there's no reason to panic. Here are a couple tips:

- If you use Zoom, make sure to keep the app up to date. Google Meet will automatically update itself.
- Review your Google Meet and Zoom settings, and make sure you have them set the way you want.
- When you have a session, take a moment to review who has joined. Don't recognize someone? Ask them to identify themselves.
- Be familiar with what to click/tap to quickly remove someone from a session.
