Virtual Undergraduate Conference Sparks Engaging Discourse



More than 1,500 people "attended" some part of the 23rd Annual Whitman Undergraduate Conference, which took place online this past Tuesday. Prerecorded presentations followed by live Q&A time, an interactive poster session in Gather.Town and multiple musical interludes filled out the schedule of this unique opportunity for Whitman students to share their original research from classes, senior theses, study abroad projects and summer internships.

Senior psychology major Emily Solomon and her thesis partners, Ben Weitzel and Ava Randall, also senior psychology majors, presented their research on the correlation between depression and emotional intelligence in undergraduate students.

"I really enjoyed the opportunity to chat with others about my thesis, even in a virtual setting. I'm glad our group decided to participate in the poster session because it allowed for more one-on-one conversations about our research, and was a great chance to connect with others about the work they've been doing," says Solomon.

A: If you fail to take an assigned surveillance test, we don't have a process for makeup testing. You cannot substitute results from a COVID test done at the Health Center or a different medical source. Your campus access will be suspended and you will be unable to enter campus buildings until after you take part in the following week's surveillance testing.

Surveillance testing notifications are sent each Friday afternoon for the coming week, along with a reminder on Monday mornings, and surveillance testing happens from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. every Monday and Tuesday at Cordiner Hall.
