# Inclusion Action Items End-of-Year Report



In June 2020, the Inclusion Task Force was assembled in response to feedback from the Whitman campus community. The task force committee, made up of students, faculty and staff, reviewed documents of incidents on Whitman's campus followed by a series of listening sessions with staff, students and faculty to gain insight into the climate on campus. Following their research and listening, certain themes emerged as areas of growth.

By the end of July 2020 action steps were identified to address the identified areas of growth and an action plan was created. In September, the <u>Inclusion</u> <u>Task Force Final Report and Action Items</u> were released to the entire campus community and the work began.

The Office of Diversity and Inclusion has compiled an <u>end-of-year report</u> with updates on the action items that have been undertaken and their current status.

# Q: Why was use of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine paused and then resumed?

A: There was a temporary pause on use of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine after reports of six cases of a rare and severe type of blood clot in individuals following administration of the vaccine. Following a thorough safety review, the FDA and CDC have determined that this vaccine is safe and effective and should continue to be

used.

#### WW County Vaccine Clinic Today



#### On-Campus Vaccine Clinic for Students This Thursday

On Thursday, April 29 from 11 a.m.–2 p.m. Whitman will host a COVID-19 vaccination clinic at Cordiner Hall. This clinic is for students only on a first-come, first-served basis while supplies last and will provide the single-dose Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine for free. The clinic will be administered by the RiteAid pharmacy team with Whitman nurses on site to assist.

This is an excellent opportunity for any student who has not already begun the vaccination process to quickly complete it with one shot and be fully vaccinated before the end of the semester.

Any student wishing to be vaccinated must bring their state-issued photo ID/driver's license or passport and, if possible, their medical insurance card. The RiteAid team will provide the vaccine consent paperwork to be filled out onsite.
