Whitman-Mayo Partnership Challenges and Fosters **Budding Scientists**



As research experiences and internships around the nation were canceled in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Assistant Professor Michael Coronado picked up the phone.

He wanted to make sure that Whitman College's first two fellows in the Whitman-Mayo Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF) program didn't miss out on the chance to work with Mayo Clinic. So he reached out to DeLisa Fairweather '87, his mentor and director of Translational Cardiovascular Research at Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida.

"We wanted to make sure that our Whitman-Mayo students still received an excellent research experience despite the situation with COVID," Coronado said. The result is a partnership that allows the fellows — senior biochemistry, biophysics and molecular biology (BBMB) majors Rudo Ndamba and Ngan Tran — to work with Fairweather and her graduate students remotely from Walla Walla.

Prevent the spread by staying local.

So far in the month of August, <u>Walla Walla County</u> confirmed 252 cases of COVID-19. Currently there are 155 residents isolating at home and four in the hospital.

The county remains in <u>Phase 2 of the Washington state Safe Start plan</u>, which includes the following guidelines:

- Gather with no more than five people total from outside your household per week.
- Outdoor recreation is permissible with up to five people from outside your household.
- Employees who can work from home should continue to do so.

Patia Named a Periclean Faculty Leader

Kaitlyn Patia, assistant professor in the Department of Rhetoric, Writing and Public Discourse, was named a Periclean Faculty Leader through the Mellon Periclean Faculty Leadership Program in the Humanities. Patia received a \$4,000 grant, which supports the development of a course dedicated to tackling the "grand challenges" of climate change, education access, immigration, mass incarceration, race and inequality or voter engagement. She will use her award to develop a Fall 2021 300-level class called "Rhetorical Field Methods: Equity and Access in Education."

Pietrantoni Shortlisted for London-based Ashurst Artist Prize

Nicole Pietrantoni, associate professor of art, is a shortlisted artist for the Ashurst Emerging Artist Prize, an international competition based in London.

Pietrantoni is one of 30 selected artists out of 3,850 entries from around the world; her artwork is currently on exhibit in the shortlist group show in London at the Ashurst from July through September 2020. Prize winners will be announced in October.
