


# Whitman Today

So far in the month of August, <u>Walla Walla County</u> confirmed 311 cases of COVID-19, 160 of those in the past 14 days. Currently there are 168 residents isolating at home and five in the hospital.

Next to Whitman's campus, on the corner of Boyer Avenue and Clinton Street, is Washington Odd Fellows. As retirement and health care centers have been frequent centers of COVID-19 outbreaks, <u>the Union-Bulletin reports</u> on how this long-term care facility, with 300 residents and 220 employees, is figuring out creative and engaging ways to address the health and relational challenges caused by coronavirus.
