### President Murray Signs America is All In Statement

President Kathy Murray has signed the <u>America Is All In statement</u>. This is an extension of We Are Still In, which she signed as it launched in 2017. The new statement intends "to reaffirm our commitment to the Paris Agreement on climate change and pledge to partner with the Biden-Harris Administration, which has made ambitious commitments to tackle the climate crisis." The statement in full, with Whitman's name listed under "Colleges & Universities", was first publicized shortly before Dec. 12, the fifth anniversary of the Paris Agreement.
