Whitman Food Pantry



Located in the Glover Alston Center (GAC), the <u>Whitman Food Pantry</u> is available seven days a week, 8 a.m.–5 p.m. including holidays and during college closures.

If you are experiencing food insecurity head over to the GAC and use your Whitman ID to gain swipe access to the building. Canned and non-perishable items are located on the second floor. Freezer items are available in the kitchen. Please make sure to observe COVID-19 policies when in the GAC:

- Grab and go: Please take the items you need and then depart the building.
- Do not hang out in the GAC individually or with others.
- The kitchen is currently not available for use. You may take items out of the freezer but do not cook at the GAC.

Q: Why was I picked for COVID-19 surveillance testing two weeks in a row?

A: We are currently testing about 1/3 of the Whitman community every week. Being tested one week does not remove you from the list of people who may be tested the next week. Therefore, the likelihood is

high that you may be randomly selected for a COVID-19 test multiple times over the semester, sometimes even two or three weeks in a row.
