Q: What happens if someone misses a required COVID-19 test?

A: The main thing that happens is their campus access is suspended. This means they cannot complete the Daily Wellness Check to receive the green "Approved to be on Campus" badge and swipe card building access is limited as follows:

- On-campus students: residence hall, Cleveland, the GAC and the Health Center
- Off-campus students: the GAC and the Health Center
- Faculty and staff: no building access

Anyone without access cannot attend or teach in-person or hybrid classes or work in on-campus offices. Student-athletes whose campus access is suspended are also not allowed to practice or compete with their teams.

In order to have campus access reinstated, a COVID-19 test must be completed during a regularly scheduled surveillance testing period.
