**View Your Results** 

We've tested 786 members of the Whitman community so far as part of our baseline surveillance testing and have three more days for the first round of testing. People who have been tested are beginning to receive their results, so watch for an email from Meenta (see screenshot above) notifying you when to log in to your dashboard and view your report.

If you are an employee or student already in town who has not yet done your first COVID-19 test, we strongly encourage you to come today as the weekend will be very busy with testing for residential students as they move in. View today's testing schedule.


