What is the Power & Privilege Symposium?

The Power & Privilege Symposium is designed to make space for conversations about means of structural oppression including racism, sexism, ableism and capitalism, and how they manifest themselves on the Whitman College campus and beyond.

The symposium strives to educate the Whitman community about the power structures prevailing around the world, questioning many of the paradigms which have socialized us. The community unites to support the lectures, panels, discussions and showcases created by our peers.

The mission of the P&P team is to create an environment where hard questions and challenges to the relationships and structures of power and privilege are welcome. The symposium is a resource forum for the continued pursuit of social justice.

Q: When will faculty be eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine?

A: There is no specific <u>vaccine distribution phase</u> for faculty or other employees of higher education institutions. Please use the <u>Washington State Phase Finder Tool</u> to determine your personal eligibility based on age, health, household characteristics and other determining factors. Note: While faculty who work in higher education institutions are defined as "<u>critical workers</u>" by the state, they are not included with K–12 educators in Phase 1B Tier 2.
