Health Tips

Hand Sanitizer Recall

Hand washing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds is one of the most effective ways of preventing the spread of coronavirus. When a sink is not available, hand sanitizer containing at least 60% ethanol is a suitable alternative. Unfortunately, the FDA reports that at least 77 widely available hand sanitizers labeled as containing ethanol actually contain potentially toxic levels of methanol (wood alcohol). These products should be discarded immediately and replaced with hand sanitizer not included in the recall.

Coronavirus in Walla Walla

The Walla Walla County Department of Health reports 86 residents with active cases of COVID-19. The past week saw 51 new confirmed cases, for a total of 345 since tracking began in March.

Boland Awarded Research at Undergraduate Institution Grant

Associate Professor of Chemistry Nate Boland has received a three-year research grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF). The Research at Undergraduate Institution (RUI) grant supports research by Boland and up to six Whitman students to study chemical reactions that affect the availability of metal ions to living organisms. This grant is awarded on the scientific merit as well as the broader impacts of the project, including science outreach in the community and involvement of undergraduate students — all of which are made possible by Whitman College's commitment to a robust and dynamic liberal arts education.


