#### Launching Fall 2021: Career Coaching for All First-Year Whitties



The Student Engagement Center (SEC) is pleased to introduce a new <u>Career</u> Coaching program launching this fall for all first-year students to build upon the SEC philosophy of having intentional, generative, forward-thinking conversations that connect a student's academic and co-curricular pursuits to their post-Whitman trajectory.

All Whitties in the class of 2025 will be paired with a SEC staff member who will introduce them to the professional, community and connective resources available via the SEC. This program aims to coalesce professional development happening in all spheres of student life and experiences, eliminating the idea that career development occurs as an enclosed process. Through reflection and connective resource introduction, student career and professional development occurs naturally as students join clubs and organizations, research for an essay, volunteer, collaborate on class projects and build relationships across campus and in the community.

### Campus COVID-19 Update

Any employee who has not provided proof of being vaccinated against COVID-19 must take a coronavirus test every week in order to receive a campus access badge valid for seven days. This testing is offered at Welty Student Health Center on Tuesdays from 8:30–10 a.m. This week, 25 employees were tested and there were no positive tests.



Current campus vaccination statistics: Employees: 86%

Students (classes of 2022, 2023 and 2024): 76% Combined total: 79%

Additionally, anyone not fully vaccinated must still wear a face mask in all indoor spaces and maintain 3 ft. physical distancing while on campus. A person is fully vaccinated when it has been at least two weeks since receiving the final required vaccine dose.
