The <u>Walla Walla County Department of Health</u> reported one new coronavirus case in the past week. Of the total 109 confirmed cases, 104 residents are now recovered.

As Walla Walla moves into <u>Phase 2 of Washington Gov. Jay Inslee's Safe</u> <u>Start economic reopening plan</u>, the college's Coronavirus Task Force is working on gradual return-to-work processes and protocols in accordance with guidelines outlined by the state. The guidelines for Phase 2 include the recommendation that office workers who are still able to telework continue to do so. #### Premera Offers Free Identity Protection Services

Premera now offers free identity protection services to active Premera members, and their dependents, with a medical plan. To take advantage of this free service, log in to your account at premera.com. Click on "my account" in the upper right side of your screen. Select "account settings" in the drop down menu. Scroll down to the "free credit monitoring services" and click "sign up today" to begin the process. You will see two options: IdentityWorks Credit 1-Bureau (for members 18 years or older) and IdentityWorks Minor Plus (for members under the age of 18 years).
