Coronavirus News

There have been no new coronavirus cases reported in Walla Walla County in the last 24 hours. There are five confirmed cases. One patient has recovered. There have been no coronavirus-related deaths reported in Walla Walla County.

Three more states issued stay at home orders on Monday – Maryland, Virginia and Washington, D.C. Roughly three out of every four people in the United States are, or soon will be, under instructions to stay inside as states try and stop the spread of coronavirus and protect hospitals from becoming overwhelmed.

Post Office Adjusts Hours

The Whitman Post Office will only be open Wednesday and Friday during the stay at home advisory.
