Last Saturday, Whitman held the first Admitted Students Saturday of the spring season. Many current students highlight visiting campus as a wonderful and defining moment in their college decisions process, and we are glad to be able to make this possible for the next class of students.

This spring's visits have been carefully crafted following social distancing protocols to keep both our campus community and our visitors safe.

- A limited number of admitted students are able to visit each Saturday, bringing one guest each.
- Participants take rapid antigen COVID tests upon arrival and will only be able to proceed if they have a negative test result.
- Students and their guests are organized into small cohorts with whom they participate in a primarily outdoor program, including a student-led campus tour, hearing from an RA about the different residence halls, eating at Cleveland Commons and participating in a Whitman experience led by a faculty, staff or student.

Admitted Students Saturdays will take place through May 15, so if you see these potential Whitties around campus give them a big welcome wave!

Q: Why are there white tents on Ankeny and by Cleveland?

A: These tents have been put up primarily to provide outdoor classroom space. There is not a scheduling or reservation process, but priority for tent use is given to faculty for holding classes. Others may use a tent if it is unoccupied. As with all campus public spaces, masks must be worn and six feet of distance must be maintained between all occupants.
