Let Your Voice be Heard: Campus climate survey for students! Take part in the campus climate survey administered by the National Assessment of Collegiate Campus Climates (NACCC). This survey will assess students' feelings about mattering, inclusion and racial climate on campus. Check your email from yesterday (Tuesday, March 23) to find the survey link. Your responses are confidential, with completed surveys will be sent directly to the NACCC and not to anyone here at Whitman.

#### Q: If I'm not going to be in Walla Walla when I'm assigned a COVID-19 surveillance test, what should I do?

A: Participation in our campus COVID testing protocol is one of our most essential safety practices this spring. Therefore, if you are assigned a test and miss it, your campus access will be suspended.

There are two possible circumstances which may warrant a temporary exemption from testing participation: accessing medical care and a family emergency. If you need to travel for either of these situations, please contact the appropriate person (listed below) as early as possible to discuss your steps for remaining compliant with Whitman's COVID testing protocols.
