# What's Next for the FSR



As President Kathy Murray noted in the Financial Sustainability Review (FSR) update vesterday, the FSR working groups have provided their final reports in consideration of all the community feedback. President Murray and the Cabinet will now spend two weeks reviewing all three reports and then provide them, along with their recommendations, to the Board of Trustees. The board will be the final decision-makers in this process. Their final decisions will happen later this month in order to inform preparations for the annual budget, which must be approved in May.

# **Surveillance Testing Protocol**

During campus surveillance testing this week there were a small number of tests (fewer than 10 that we know of) that were mislabeled, likely because of test subjects with similar names. This resulted in some participants having their access to campus revoked for not showing up when they were, in fact, tested. When we learned of this mistake, we immediately granted campus access back to those affected. In response, we are tightening up our protocols to ensure that every ID is checked and every individual is asked to confirm that their ID matches the name pulled up on the computer. Moving forward, the testing check-out person will ask you to confirm that your name is correct on the computer screen before your sample is scanned every time you are tested, and even if they already know who you are. This will help us avoid misidentified test samples in the future.
