

The cover story, <u>At the Art of the</u> <u>Matter</u>, explores Whitman's art collection as it expands to better reflect artistic diversity in the Walla Walla Valley and beyond.

Recent acquisitions include prints by Iranian artist Hamid Rahmanian based on a 10th-century Persian epic poem and more than 30 prints from the <u>Crow's Shadow Institute of the</u> <u>Arts</u>, home to the only printmaking studio in the country that supports emerging and established Native American artists.



## Q: If I get the COVID-19 vaccine, do I still have to take part in Whitman's surveillance testing?


