Weekly Update from the President



Coronavirus News

Gov. Jay Inslee is extending Washington's stay-home order through May 31 in an attempt to prevent a second round of coronavirus cases. In the plan laid out Friday, Washington's economy and social life would reopen in four phases, with some types of businesses beginning to reopen in mid-May in the first phase.

Each phase for reopening will take at least three weeks, to allow state officials to assess if the approach is working. The dates for each phase were not announced. The governor cited a number of models and metrics that will inform his decision-making, including the daily number of new confirmed cases, as well as COVID-19 fatalities, hospital data and projections for how the virus may spread.

Additional outdoor activities will be allowed starting this week, but the ban on large gatherings remains in place.

Since Friday, there were 11 new positive coronavirus tests in Walla Walla County. So far there have been 88 confirmed cases in the county and 34 residents have recovered from the virus.
