Coronavirus News

Walla Walla has seen its first death from coronavirus — a man in his 70s with underlying health conditions. In the last 24 hours, there were two new positive coronavirus tests in the county. There have been a total of 94 confirmed cases and 40 residents have recovered from the virus.

Washington Gov. Jay Inslee says the state is working with industry groups to create protocols to open other businesses listed in Phase 1 "by this week or early next week." These include landscaping, auto sales, dog walking, retail curbside pickup and car washes. Inslee said that these protocols will be announced by early next week so businesses can reopen.

Inslee has outlined a four-phase approach to reopening Washington. Included in the plan is when restaurant dining rooms could welcome customers back. Restaurants and taverns are referenced in Phase 2 of the plan, which calls for dining rooms with less than 50% of capacity, tables with no more than five people and no bar area seating. Phase 2 could start as soon as June 1.
