## Coronavirus News

There were no new positive coronavirus tests in Walla Walla County in the last 24 hours. So far there have been 94 confirmed cases in the county and 41 residents have recovered from the virus. As the U.S. and Europe loosen their lockdowns against the coronavirus, health experts are expressing growing concern over what they say is an all but certain second wave of deaths and infections that could force governments to clamp back down.

The number of children with a mysterious illness most likely connected to COVID-19 is growing. There are now at least 64 reported cases in New York state and several more across the U.S. and in Europe. Symptoms include a high temperature lasting over five days along with a rash, swollen neck glands, dry cracked lips, swelling of the hands and feet, and redness in both eyes. The condition suggests that, contrary to early hopes, young people will not be spared from the virus's effects.
