Coronavirus News

In the last 24 hours, there was one new positive coronavirus test in Walla Walla County. That makes for a total of 95 confirmed cases in the county and 54 residents have recovered from the virus.

By the end of the day, Gov. Jay Inslee's office is expected to issue guidance to restart the remaining phase-one businesses. That would allow landscapers and pet walkers back to work, and for retail stores to offer curbside pickup. Guidance for restarting some businesses listed in phase two of the reopening— which could begin soon in some less-affected rural counties, if their plans are approved — could also come as early as today.

More than 40 states are at least partially reopened, but there is still some confusion about guidance from the federal government after the White House opted to ignore the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's recommendations for reopening America.
