## Meet the Office of Grants & Foundation Relations

Faculty members, do you want to apply for a grant? The Office of Grants & Foundation Relations is here to help.

If your research/scholarship plans for the summer include searching and applying for grants, or if you already have plans to apply, please get in touch.

The Office of Grants & Foundation Relations wants to know about any grant, no matter how large or small. Please fill out the <u>proposal development form</u> at least one month before the proposal deadline. This will let all relevant parties know about your application. Remember, most grants are awarded to Whitman College, so this office is responsible for making sure any commitments made in the application are upheld.

The office helps with budget and proposal development, and also makes sure applications follow all the rules and regulations in order to give you the best chance of success.

### Summer Salary—Explained!

Would you like to be compensated for the research you do in the summer? Many grants allow summer pay for faculty who are on nine-month contracts. To calculate your summer salary, divide your annual salary by nine to obtain the monthly rate. The maximum amount allowed is dictated by federal, institutional, or grant guidelines, but faculty typically can request one or two months of salary for the summer.

A: You can find COVID-19 vaccines using the CDC's <u>online nationwide Vaccine Locator</u>. Just enter your zip code and it will tell you specific nearby locations, what type of vaccines they are offering and how to make an appointment.

And don't forget: in the fall, the vaccine is required for all students, so complete the <u>COVID-19 Vaccination Reporting Form</u> as soon as you've finished your vaccination process!

### Student Food Resources


