Update from the Board of Trustees



As reported in a May 13 email from President Murray to all Whitman community members, the Board of Trustees met via Zoom on Monday, May 10, to conduct its spring business. The most significant agenda item was the budget for fiscal year 2022, a budget that was brought into balance through the efforts of the Financial Sustainability Review (FSR). The budget, which was unanimously approved by the board, includes restoration of faculty and staff salaries to prepandemic levels as of July 1, restoration of the college's 10% contribution to faculty and staff retirement accounts as of July 1, along with restoration of a number of the non-personnel cuts necessitated by our lower enrollment and additional expenses related to COVID-19.

The board also elected and welcomed four new trustees: Danielle Garbe Reser '97, Mark Kajita, Charlie Nelson '83 (who is also parent to an '08 graduate) and Ann Watson '83. They heard a very encouraging enrollment update from Josh Jensen and received updates on next steps with FSR implementation, including a report from Sharon Alker on the faculty's work related to classics and environmental humanities. Perhaps most important, they voted to pre-approve the faculty motion to confer degrees at Whitman's 2021 commencement.

The board and cabinet expressed deep appreciation for the efforts of the entire Whitman community to keep each other safe and healthy and to continue to advance student learning during this extraordinary year, and extend their best wishes for a wonderful summer.
