Announcing the David Nord Award Winner




The Intercultural Center has announced rising senior Sara Little as the recipient of the 2021 David Nord Award, presented annually to encourage the Whitman community to engage critical issues facing LGBTQIA+ communities through a variety of creative and scholarly mediums.

Little will be working over the summer and next fall on a project titled "Crafting a Queer Ecology: Art of a Queer Nature."

Little says: "Winning the David Nord Award has given me the opportunity to develop an interdisciplinary project that is directly aligned with my passions and identity. Creating an art exhibit on queer ecology will force questions within our community on what is 'natural,' and build an appreciation and understanding of the diverse sexualities and gender expression presented, or absent, in nature. Through this project, I hope to learn more about myself as a curious, queer artist, and expose others to the joy of a fluid and personal natural world.
