## Q&A with Whitman's 2021 Commencement Speaker



We are thrilled to welcome Jena Griswold '06 back to Whitman to speak at this weekend's 135th Commencement! Griswold was a politics and Spanish major who received several prestigious fellowships, earned a law degree, and worked for President Barack Obama's re-election campaign before becoming the Colorado Secretary of State.

## Q: Are masks going to be required at Whitman this summer for people who are vaccinated?

A: Beginning next Monday, May 24, vaccinated individuals may participate in outdoor activities and recreation without a mask as long as 6 ft. of distancing can be maintained. Masks will still be required inside buildings but we will continue to evaluate and update our campus protocols as further national and state guidance, including guidance specific to higher ed, is released.
