As a reminder, Walla Walla is still in Phase 2 of the Safe Start plan, which limits us to essential travel only. For this reason, we encourage students to restrict travel over the holidays. If you do plan to return home, we strongly urge you to make one trip total for the break: if you return home for Thanksgiving, you should consider staying until you need to be back in Walla Walla in January (for most students).

Also, to protect your families and friends, the state public health experts advise you to:

- Restrict activities for two weeks before returning home, limiting all inperson gatherings.
- Wear masks at home among friends and family members, and practice good social distancing from family members as much as possible for two weeks after returning home.

Thank you for taking steps to protect our communities and your family from this deadly virus.


