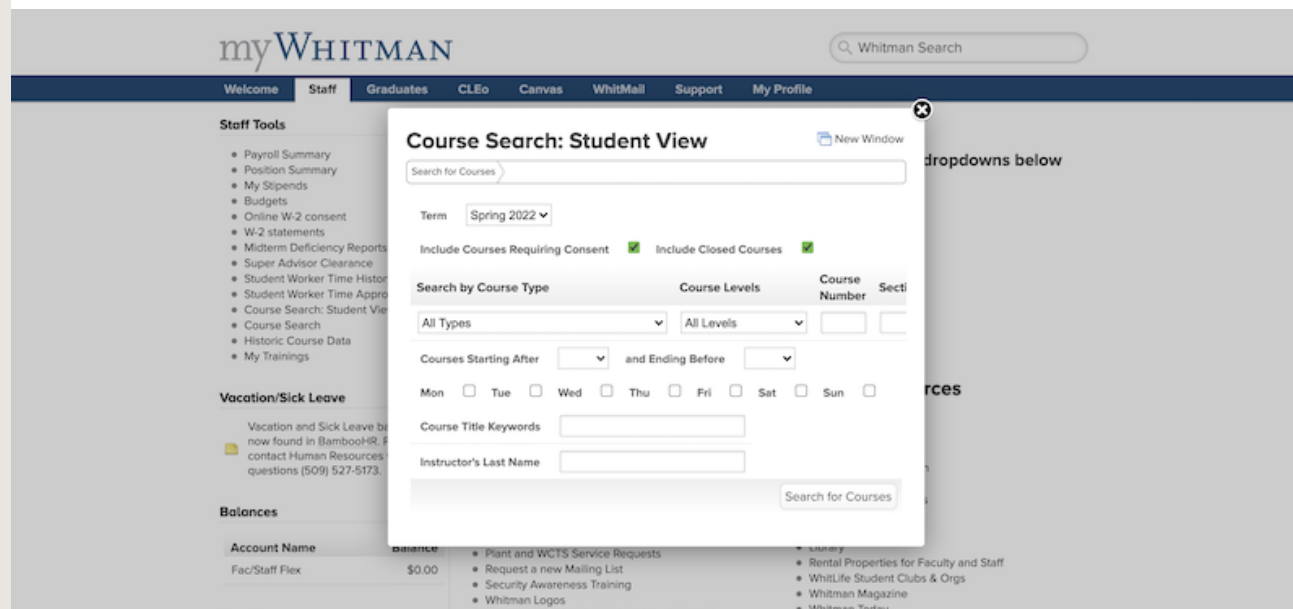

Spring Pre-Registration Starts This Week



Spring 2022 pre-registration begins on Thursday! Students, review the tips below and [the instructions from the Registrar's Office](#) to make sure you are ready when it's your turn.

Advisor Clearance: You are required to have advisor clearance before your pre-registration lotto time. Contact your advisor today and request clearance.

Registration Lotto Time: View your pre-registration lotto time at the top of the page in the "Registration" area of your portal ([mywhitman.edu](#)).

Search for Courses: There is a new and improved search option to help in preparing for pre-registration. When you select the "Course Types" pull down you can indicate whether you wish to:

- 1) Search for classes in a specific distribution area;
- 2) Choose from the list of "Interdisciplinary" courses to show classes which can be used for interdisciplinary majors; or
- 3) Search for classes in a specific department (subject).

Spring '22 Wishlist: Go to the "Registration" area in your portal ([mywhitman.edu](#)) to add courses to your Spring 2022 Wish List. If you see current semester courses in your Wish List go into "Search for Courses" to add a course then it will switch over to SP22 wish list.
