Division of Diversity and Inclusion Updates



The Division of Diversity and Inclusion has been actively contributing to institutional efforts to advance diversity, equity and inclusion at Whitman. The following is a brief highlight of some activities over the last several weeks, with more details available in the <u>full update on our website</u>.

Intercultural Center (IC): the IC continues to provide a wide variety of support to students, including the Power & Privilege Symposium leadership, the Inclusion Fellows and a variety of student clubs and organizations.

International Student and Scholar Services: through collaboration with a number of faculty and staff a specialized applied learning has been created to provide more equitable access to paid internships for international students.

Religious and Spiritual Life (RSL): the RSL office recently launched an interfaith council of students to engage in dialogue and model cross-religious cooperation. RSL also continues to publish Around the Table monthly with contributions from the campus community.

Division of Diversity and Inclusion: staffing changes include a promotion for Greg Lecki as well as the ongoing search for a Director of Equity & Compliance/Title IX Coordinator and Executive Assistant to the Vice President for Diversity and Inclusion. The division has also provided staff supervisors with an online course in diversity, inclusion and belonging.

Apply Now: Faculty Grants for Community Engaged Learning The Community Engaged Learning and Research Initiative (CELRI) committee invites interested faculty to apply for a <u>Partnership Grant</u> which supports longerterm community engaged learning (CEL) work, such as investigating CEL component possibilities, locating and planning with community partners, researching CEL pedagogies, or carrying out an already designed project. There are two deadlines for Partnership Grants: Dec. 1, 2021 and Feb. 9, 2022.

If you are looking for funding for a shorter term community engaged learning project, consider applying for a <u>Collaboration Grant</u>. Examples of community partner roles in short-term engagements include guest speaker, panel participant, local trip liaison, etc. Associated costs may include community partner stipends, travel expenses, workshop materials, etc.

COVID-19 Case on Campus

Positive COVID-19 cases in our campus community are noted in Whitman Today in compliance with state regulations. We also update the data in our <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> every Monday.

In accordance with Washington state Labor & Industries employer requirements, we are notifying the campus community that in the past 24 hours, a person with Whitman access was confirmed positive for COVID-19. This person is now in isolation for 10 days in accordance with our campus and CDC guidelines. Though the likelihood of transmission is low due to our <u>campus</u> <u>COVID-19 protocols</u>, it is possible that others may have been exposed to COVID-19. There is nothing you need to do at this time aside from following our campus COVID-19 protocols. Anyone identified through the contact tracing process as a close contact (within 6 ft. for at least 15 minutes over 24 hours) will be personally notified.
