

#### Flu Shots Available for Students



To support our students in accessing this important preventative care, Whitman is providing free flu vaccinations to all students in Walla Walla. Flu shots are available at the Welty Student Health Center today and tomorrow between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. and no appointment is necessary.

If you are a student living outside Walla Walla, flu shots are generally paid for by insurance and are often available without appointment in grocery store and drugstore pharmacies.

#### **Inclusion Task Force Action Items:** October Update

It has only been a little over a month since the Inclusion Task Force Action Items went live, and actions are underway! Over this past month, we have worked with Fall 2020 action item implementation leaders to plan the vision, anticipate potential barriers & roadblocks and develop the execution strategy. Below is a snapshot of some of the work underway:

- Yesterday, Development had their #AllinforWhitman giving day for the Whitman Fund, where diversity and inclusion was one of the designated
- Friday, the Offices of Diversity, Equity & Inclusion from the Walla Walla Tri-Colleges will be hosting a wellness call on microaggressions for faculty and staff from marginalized identities.
- Student organizations are currently being trained utilizing the intergroup dialogue model, and several organizations have completed implicit bias
- A steering committee for the Peer Educators' Program has been formed.
- New faculty orientation is continuing this semester and has been expanded to include faculty that have been at Whitman for three years or less.
- Two subcommittees of WIDE have been designated to: 1) create and maintain a campus climate webpage; and 2) plan and organize a faculty and staff training day.
- The chair of the faculty has reached out to the faculty asking for volunteers to serve on the Black Studies Program feasibility committee.
- Admissions has committed to intentionally increasing high school and organizational partnerships to aid in recruiting black students starting this
