Whitman Athletics has bolstered its facilities and events personnel, elevating Stephen Gall to director of facilities and events and hiring Kahili Helm as assistant event and facility management. Helm will also serve as Whitman's club sports coordinator.

Gall was hired in 2017 as assistant director of event management and sport communication. In addition to overseeing the maintenance and improvement of all Whitman's athletics facilities, he heads up game operations for all Whitman home athletics contests. Whitman has hosted several postseason events under his watch including the NCAA West Region Cross Country Championships and NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament in the same year.
