## COVID-19 Case on Campus


In accordance with Washington state Labor & Industries employer requirements, we are notifying the campus community that in the past 24 hours, a person with Whitman access was confirmed positive for COVID-19. # "Find a Time" for Meetings

One of the benefits of using the calendar linked to your Whitman-provided Google account is the ability to easily find meeting times that work for multiple people through the "Find a time" function.



Using this tool will help you schedule a meeting when you know everyone is free (assuming they all keep their calendars up to date!), so you can hopefully avoid a series of conflicts and excuses. Another option is to choose "Suggest a time" for each participant. This feature prompts the system to automatically generate a list of meeting time options, so you can select the one you feel works best.
