Get Your Flu Vaccine



Flu activity was unusually low last year. That's partially because a lot of people got their flu vaccines, but it was also a result of the COVID-19 safety measures like masking, staying home and limiting gatherings.

This year, people are active again. This means we have a much higher risk of exposure to the flu virus. And with last year's low activity, most people weren't exposed to flu viruses to develop natural immunity this season.

Getting the flu vaccine is your best defense at protection from the flu. And this year, it's more important than ever to get vaccinated. The flu vaccine can keep you from spreading the flu to others during the COVID-19 pandemic and helps keep our hospitals from getting even more overwhelmed than they already are.

The Washington Department of Health recommends that you get your flu vaccine before the end of October for the best protection through the fall and winter months when flu is most likely to spread. The vaccine is available at local pharmacies including Safeway, RiteAid, Walgreens and Walmart as well as through your primary health care provider.

Welty Student Health Center has ordered doses of the flu vaccine and will hold an on-campus clinic once those arrive. First priority for the on-campus flu vaccine clinic will be for students, and then we will open it to employees if doses remain. Watch Whitman Today for updates on this clinic.

Are You Eligible for the Pfizer Booster?

Third ("booster") doses of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine are now available in Walla Walla for anyone who is at least six months past their second dose and meets the following criteria:

- People 65 and older,
- People living in a long-term care facility,
- People 18-64 with underlying medical conditions,
- People 18-64 who work in education, health care, homeless shelters, public transit, grocery stores, correctional facilities, the food industry, manufacturing or as first responders.

People who received the Johnson & Johnson or Moderna vaccines should not receive any additional doses at this time.

With the Find a Doctor tool, you can:

- See cost estimates for common procedures based on your network.
- Find specialty doctors.
- Locate urgent care centers close to your home or current location.
- See a provider's ratings and awards.
