# Google calendar appointment scheduler

Lots of meetings to schedule? You can use Google calendar to create appointment slots that people at Whitman can sign up for.

In your Whitman Google calendar, create an event and click on "Appointment slots." After you have determined how long an appointment should take and saved the slots, you can open the Google calendar appointment page and see the slots that people will select to sign up for an appointment with you. Copy the url from the top of the appointment page and paste it into an email, a Canvas announcement or however else you are informing people of your available times.

Once someone has signed up for an appointment with you, you can add a Google Meet link directly to the invitation that appears on your calendar or email the person you're meeting with a Zoom link or other notification.

Google help has <u>additional instructions</u> to walk you through setting up appointments. There are also third-party tools you can use to book appointments, such as YouCanBook.me, that you can integrate with your Google calendar.
