
#### What Can You Do in WhitLife?

## COVID-19 Case on Campus

Any positive COVID cases in our campus community will be noted in Whitman Today in compliance with state regulations.

In accordance with new Washington state Labor & Industries employer requirements, we are notifying the campus community that in the past 24 hours, two people with Whitman access were confirmed as positive for COVID-19. These people are now in isolation for 10 days in accordance with our campus and CDC guidelines. Though the likelihood of transmission is low due to our <u>campus COVID-19 protocols</u>, it is possible that others may have been exposed to COVID-19. There is nothing you need to do at this time aside from following our campus COVID-19 protocols. Anyone identified through the contact tracing process as a close contact (within 6 ft. for at least 15 minutes over 24 hours) will be personally notified.
