
# Whitman College Climbs Nine Spots on U.S. News & World Report Rankings

In its annual rankings released yesterday, U.S. News & World Report recognized Whitman as No. 38 on its list of <u>National Liberal Arts Colleges</u>, up from No. 47 last year. Whitman numbers among the select institutions featured in the 2022 edition of the <u>U.S. News Best Colleges</u> guidebook, available in print later this fall.

"While we don't rely on outside rankings to tell our story, it's always gratifying when they affirm what we already know: that this is a very special place to live and learn," said President Kathleen Murray. "We know many families look at these rankings when they are making college decisions, and we are very proud to see Whitman again acknowledged as one of the leading liberal arts colleges in the country."

### What To Do With Lost and Found Items

- Send an email describing the item and when and where it was found to <a href="mailto:lostandfound@whitman.edu">lostandfound@whitman.edu</a>. (Note: please do not ever share information or images that include sensitive personal information such as birth dates, credit/debit card numbers, etc.)
- Items found in campus buildings may be left with the building's administrative staff
- administrative staff.Found items may be given to Security by calling 509-527-5777.

If you lose an item on campus, here are a few things to do:

- Send an email describing the item and when and where it may have been lost to <a href="mailto:lostandfound@whitman.edu">lostandfound@whitman.edu</a>.
- Check with building administrators in any building where you may have left the item.
- Check with Security to see if the item has been turned in to them. Items
  turned in to Security are stored at their office in the Whitman College
  Technology Services building.

Unclaimed items are donated quarterly to local thrift stores.

## COVID-19 Case on Campus

In accordance with Washington state Labor & Industries employer requirements, we are notifying the campus community that in the past 24 hours, a person with Whitman access was confirmed positive for COVID-19. This person is now in isolation for 10 days in accordance with our campus and CDC guidelines. Though the likelihood of transmission is low due to our campus COVID-19 protocols, it is possible that others may have been exposed to COVID-19. There is nothing you need to do at this time aside from following our campus COVID-19 protocols. Anyone identified through the contact tracing process as a close contact (within 6 ft. for at least 15 minutes over 24 hours) will be personally notified.
