UWC is a global network of schools and educational programs with the shared mission of "making education a force to unite people, nations and cultures for peace and a sustainable future." The organization was founded on the principles of German educationalist Kurt Hahn in 1962 to promote intercultural understanding. Whitman is proud to participate in the <u>Davis UWC Scholar Program</u>, the largest international scholarship program for undergraduates in the world.

UWC Day is an annual event that celebrates the strength and diversity of the UWC movement and their mission for a more peaceful and sustainable future through connecting and mobilizing UWC alumni globally. It serves as a chance to spread the word about UWC, their work and values, and is also an opportunity for the UWC community to reflect on what they do as a movement, to determine how to be more effective changemakers and to continue to challenge themselves.

Vaccination Update



We are extremely pleased to report that our campus COVID-19 vaccination rate has reached another benchmark. As of today, we have 98.49% of students and 95.07% of employees vaccinated, for a total of 97.63%. We know that number will rise slightly as members of our campus community complete the vaccination process this week and next, and will provide another update the first week of October.

COVID-19 Case on Campus

Positive COVID-19 cases in our campus community are noted in Whitman Today in compliance with state regulations. We also update the data in our <u>COVID-19</u>

<u>Dashboard</u> every Monday.

In accordance with Washington state Labor & Industries employer requirements, we are notifying the campus community that in the past 24 hours, a person with Whitman access was confirmed positive for COVID-19. This person is now in isolation for 10 days in accordance with our campus and CDC guidelines. Though the likelihood of transmission is low due to our campus COVID-19 protocols, it is possible that others may have been exposed to COVID-19. There is nothing you need to do at this time aside from following our campus COVID-19 protocols. Anyone identified through the contact tracing process as a close contact (within 6 ft. for at least 15 minutes over 24 hours) will be personally notified.
