Division of Diversity and Inclusion Update



The Division of Diversity and Inclusion has been actively contributing to institutional efforts to advance diversity, equity and inclusion at Whitman College.

International Student and Scholar Services is supporting Whitman's largest-ever international student cohort, 177 students total, which includes 60 first-year students from 36 different countries.

The Office of Religious and Spiritual Life conducts regular weekly programs like the "Big Tent" gatherings to bring together community members who share a religious, non-religious, or spiritual identity.

The Intercultural Center continues to develop and grow the Inclusion Fellows Program, with several new fellows joining this year, as well as working on the support and development of our diversity clubs and affinity groups.

The Division of Diversity and Inclusion is working through the transition of the new Vice President for Diversity and Inclusion, Dr. John Johnson. In addition to getting to know campus community members and providing them with training and resources, the search is underway for two new staff members: a director of equity and compliance/Title IX coordinator and an executive assistant.

COVID-19 Case on Campus

Positive COVID-19 cases in our campus community are noted in Whitman Today in compliance with state regulations. We also update the data in our <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Dashboard</u> every Monday.

In accordance with Washington state Labor & Industries employer requirements, we are notifying the campus community that in the past 24 hours, a person with Whitman access was confirmed positive for COVID-19. This person is now in isolation for 10 days in accordance with our campus and CDC guidelines. Though the likelihood of transmission is low due to our <u>campus COVID-19 protocols</u>, it is possible that others may have been exposed to COVID-19. There is nothing you need to do at this time aside from following our campus COVID-19 protocols. Anyone identified through the contact tracing process as a close contact (within 6 ft. for at least 15 minutes over 24 hours) will be personally notified.
